Message from the Saskatchewan Elks Foundation Chairman: Bro. Joe Calder

Every thing in the Foundation seems to be going well. The Senior Citizens part of the Foundation has been quite busy this past year with trying to purchase the homes at Hanley and Moosomin. Brother Tony will bring you up to date on these.

The Charity Appeal seemed to do fairly well in June. The income was less than in 2006 and 2007 but very close. The income in 2007 was about \$80,000, in 2006 it was about \$79,000 and in 2008 it was about \$78,000. The expenses were about the same every year. Each of the last three years the person winning has taken the cash payout which has helped us out. If they had taken the car or truck our balance sheet might not of looked so good. I am suggesting that we set a limit on how much we spent for prizes. I am suggesting that we do not spent anymore than \$30,000 total including taxes on prizes.

The Walk-A-Thon in Shaunavon was very well run. The Foundation would like to thank all the Brother Elks and R/P for the fine job they did in putting on this event. The Moosomin Lodge will have gotten some ideas and I am sure they will run a successful event too. It will be interesting to see how the new prize structure will work out. I hope that are successful in selling more tickets. All the money left over from this event goes to The Elks and R/P Fund for Children.

The other event that we hold is held this weekend here in Nipawin. We do hope it makes some money as it has in the passed. The Nipawin Elks and Royal have done a very good job in the passed. We would like to thank the members of the two lodges for all their dedication in putting on this event. Maybe we should look at the prize structure in this event too. May be we should have one major prize or cash instead and the smaller prizes be cash.. We have also had some inquires into how long Nipawin is going to host the Peace 100 and they are wondering if other lodges will soon get a chance to host this event.

One other thing I like to talk about is the amount of money that we give back to lodges for selling tickets. Several years ago a resolution was passed on the floor to raise the amount to 45% from 30%. The reason for raising it was that if the lodges were to get more back from the tickets sold, that more tickets would be sold. I do not think that has happen. I would like to suggest that where resolution section 4, 4.3. 2 says that we return 45% of the net profit back to the lodges we change it a bit. I would like it to say that we still return 45% to the lodges but before sending out the money that we take 15% of that

amount and sent it to the Elks and R/P Fund in the name of the lodge so they get credit for donations to the fund. When the lodge receive it 30% share it can give it to local charities or give it to the Elks And R/P Fund for Children or the Saskatchewan Elks Foundation. The reason for giving this money to charities is that what the Saskatchewan Lotteries tells us we have to do. The Saskatchewan Elks Foundation must sent in a report of where the money went and that is the reason you must report back to us what charity you sent it too. The reason for this is that the Saskatchewan Elks and R/P are not keeping up in their share of the amount of money that the fund spends in Saskatchewan. The biggest amount that comes from the fund at one time is \$100,000 for the SPARC program. This is a very important program to the children of Saskatchewan and has helped hundreds of children and we should be putting in our share and not relying on the other provinces or the reserves to pick up what we don't put in

As always I would like the Provincial Executive and anyone part of the Saskatchewan Elks Association to promote the sale of tickets for each of our three draws. They are important to the well fare of our Association . I would also like to ask you to promote the use of the funds to help people who need some kind of assistance if they qualify.

CHARITY APPEAL:

Everything is going good and all the Lodges have their tickets for the Charity Appeal draw. Please plan to attend the Provincial Conference on June 12 & 13, 2009 to vote on the changes to the Charity Appeal Prize Structure. Everyone should participate in the discussion.

INVESTIGATING COMMITTEE:

The Investigating Committee wishes to advise that the Personal Assistance Application Form has been revised and was previously sent out in the December Bulletin. Many Lodges and/or their charity committees were not fully aware how to prepare a Foundation Personal Assistance Claim Forms. A "How to List" has been prepared as below and is also available from the Provincial Office 665-1333.

**SASKATCHEWAN ELKS FOUNDATION CORP.
PERSONAL ASSISTANCE GUIDELINES
PROCEDURE TO FOLLOW BY LODGES**

1. All requests must be sponsored by one of the following:
A) Saskatchewan Elks B) Saskatchewan R/P
2. Personal Assistance Application Form must be signed by two officers. Of the requesting body. A 10% financial commitment from the sponsoring body shall be stated on the form. This could be waived.
3. A completed application form identifying the family's income/expenses, assets/liabilities along with a copy of the family's most recent income tax assessment., shall be submitted to the Sask. Elks Foundation Corp.
4. If the applicant is applying for personal assistance for medical Related problems, a letter from their doctor is required.
5. The lodge submitting the request for funding should have a covering letter.
6. Request for funding for equipment, shall be purchased by the Foundation, organization or an individual.
7. Requests for funding from the Foundation shall be considered by the Investigating Committee /or at a meeting of the Foundation.
8. The maximum Personal Assistance Grant shall not exceed \$3,000.00 in any one case of the fiscal year of the Foundation.
9. If assistance is granted, the cheque will be made in the name of the Sponsoring lodge, the sponsoring lodge will then issue a cheque to
The claimant and disperse.
10. The lodge submitting the request must inform the applicant of the Decision of the Foundation.
11. The absence of any information may result in a delay to process an application.
